Animal Intake Policy

Ring Dog Rescue's mission is to find permanent adoptive homes for pit bull type dogs or other types of dogs in need from animal control agencies, animal shelters (both public and private), and on occasion dogs surrendered by their owners for good cause.

All dogs accepted into Ring Dog Rescue are on a case-by-case basis. Amy Katherine Taylor and Tonya Irizarry will make final decision regarding intake of a dog. Ring Dog Rescue does not discriminate based on breed, health, injury, or age. It is our policy to first look for and identify dogs that are in the most need of medical care and consider those animals for intake prior to the intake of a healthy dog. Ring Dog Rescue has a specific program, Posy's Pocket, for the intake of senior and/or terminally ill dogs. Ring Dog Rescue also has a specific program, the Low Riding Crew, for the intake of small dogs and hounds. Ring Dog Rescue is a foster-based organization, which is limited on intake based on which foster home or how many foster homes are open at any specific time.

Ring Dog Rescue has a 60-acre farm located in Prince George County, Virginia. We accept farmed animals on a case-by-case basis from municipal shelters and occasionally from the public. The farmed animals live the rest of their lives in the comfort and care of Ring Dog Rescue.

Intake procedures and policies are determined by the Ring Dog Rescue Board of Directors and may be changed or reviewed at anytime.
