Intake Policy

- 1. Evaluate the urgency of the situation the animal is in.
- 2. Evaluate the location of the animal will transport be available?
- 3. Evaluate the health of the animal regarding affecting the health of the existing residents.
 - a. Is our Quarantine barn available?
 - b. Is immediate Veterinary Care needed?
- 4. Do we have the space available to provide the needed pasture & shelter?
- 5. Do we have the manpower to properly care for the animal initially & ongoing?
- 6. Do we have the needed finances to handle the initial and ongoing care of the animal?
- 7. Will the animal be able to go into an existing herd or will they have to be separated into a new area?

As we want to help all animals, saying No to an animal in need, is the hardest thing we have to do. Since we have a very limited volunteer base, the daily care of all the animals can never be jeopardized by a new animal resident. We will always do our best to help every animal that needs our help.
